


AAPT 128th Winter Conference, Radisson Deauville Hotel, Miami Beach, FL

The Radisson-Deauville Hotel is located on north Collins Avenue in Miami Beach. During the 1950s and 60s it was a popular resort for celebrities and show people. The Beatles stayed, and performed, at the hotel in 1964 during their first trip to America, appearing on the Ed Sullivan show. Pictures of many celebrities of the time grace various locations around the hotel, Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Sammy Davis Jr, to name a few.
