President's Report: AAPT is in good financial health. Reserves are almost up to one year's budget.

Treasurer's Report: The budget for this year is \$5.4M. Major sources of income are grants, projects and publications. Long term savings amount to \$3.6M. The goal is to raise this to one year's budget.

Section Rep's Report: Newly elected positions and officers were announced. A sign-in form was circulated.

Executive Officer's Report: AAPT works with new faculty members at colleges and universities on matters of pedagogy. One current task force has a mandate to identify healthy undergraduate programs. Results will be posted on the web site.

AAPT will provide continuing support for the international Physics Olympiad. Other programs can be reviewed on the web site.

A current issue is the impact of electronic journals on the income flow. A task force has been struck to deal with this issue.

AAPT will be selling the Dodge building.

A survey is in the works aimed at non-members to seek ways in which they can be induced to join AAPT.

Section reps must be members of AAPT. Should a section rep fail to renew membership, he/she is automatically dropped from the list of section reps.
